ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN MENTAL HEALTH

MHT courses in this program meet the qualifications for the MHRT—Community certification by DHHS and the Muskie Institute Center for Learning

The Associate in Applied Science degree in Mental Health will prepare students for entry-level and above positions in areas of substance abuse, mental health rehabilitation, developmental disabilities services, and gerontology. Concentrations in geriatrics and child services are under consideration for the future.

Graduates of this program will be able to apply to the Muskie Institute Center for Learning for the MHRT—Community certification. This certification allows workers to apply for Case Management positions within specific social services agencies. In addition, work could be found in the following capacities; activity therapist associate, addictions counselor, crisis counselor, human development associate, rehabilitation worker, family worker, senior site manager, acridity director, volunteer coordinator, and daily living support specialist. Facilities that employ these positions include nursing homes, boarding homes, hospitals, and social and mental health service agencies.
