Crisis and Counseling Centers is seeking Residential Crisis Workers to work in our Augusta, Winslow, and Waterville Crisis Stabilization Units. Residential Crisis Workers support adults and children who have experienced a mental health crisis or traumatic life event. Our residential houses are used for short term stays, as an alternative to hospitalization.

Staff provide risk assessments, treatment planning, support groups, and coordinate services for discharge planning. In addition, staff are responsible for maintaining a therapeutic environment while protecting client confidentiality and rights.

Hours:

First Shift- 8:00am to 4:00pm Overnight Shift- 12:00am to 8:00am

The ideal candidate would:

- Have experience in a residential setting (preferred, but not required).
- Have experience working with individuals with mental illness.
- Maintain clear boundaries with clients.
- Have a valid driver's license and vehicle insurance.

Education Requirements:

- Associates degree in Social Services related field *preferred*.
- High school diploma or GED required.
- MHRT I or MHRT C certified (*preferred*, but not required)

Pay Range:

This is an hourly position and the pay starts at \$13.50/hr.

*Shift Differentials for 2nd shift, 3rd shift as well as weekends can increase your base pay up to \$3 / hour.
