

The emblem of Phi Theta Kappa consists of a golden slab keyed at the top and bottom. Across the center of the slab is a black enameled band upon which three mystic Greek letters appear. These initials stand for the three mystic Greek words meaning Wisdom (Phi), Aspiration (Theta), and Purity (Kappa).

Behind the band is a wreath, one side of oak leaves, and the other, laurel. The wreath of oak leaves denotes stability and strength of character, and the curling leaves of laurel signify achievement and success.

Above the band is a representation of the head of Athena, Goddess of Learning. In the base appear the mystic Greek letters symbolizing the Light of Learning and Knowledge.

Established for women in 1918 by presidents of Missouri Junior Colleges, Phi Theta Kappa was recognized in 1929 by the American Association of Junior Colleges (now known as the American Association of Community Colleges) as the official honor society for two-year colleges, and today has a presence in nine sovereign nations.

Phi Theta Kappa's mission is two-fold:

1. Recognize and encourage the academic achievement of twoyear college students and;

2. Provide opportunities for individual growth and development through participation in honors, leadership, service, and fellowship programming.
